Main function

This part-time, fixed term position (available for up to a maximum of 2 days per week to the end of March 2027) is being created to enable clinicians to develop and lead (+/- deliver) cancer clinical trials-related research.

Main Duties and Responsibilities

- Undertake development (+/- delivery) of academic and/or industry cancer clinical trials-related activity led from Wales.
- Form connections within the Welsh research environment, for example: link with academic researchers in CReSt themes to develop trials and any associated translational projects; join the WCRC Early- and Mid-Career Researcher Network; or work with the Cardiff Cancer Research Hub on trials supported by commercial sources of funding.
- Produce outputs of this work that may include: submission of research funding applications on which the individual is a lead or co-applicant; associated recruitment of patients into Wales-led cancer clinical trials; presentations of methodology or results; and submission of peer-reviewed publications on which the individual is an author.
- Contribute updates on activity and outputs to WCRC's quarterly and end of year reporting to the funder. If required, attend WCRC leadership group meetings on request to provide a verbal update on progress.
- Any other duties not included above, but consistent with the role.

Essential Criteria

Qualifications and Education

1. Clinician employed by NHS Wales who is:
 - a consultant in oncology, surgery and/or other cancer-related disciplines such as palliative care, general practice, etc. OR
 - a senior member of other professional groups working in cancer, including nurses, allied health professionals, clinical scientists, or others who are in a position to lead cancer trials/translational research from Wales.
2. Works in a cancer specialty; or cancer prevention, detection, diagnosis or cancer patient support form a substantial part of their NHS role.

Knowledge, Skills and Experience

3. A track record of working on clinical research studies, as an principal investigator and/or recruiter.

Communication and Team Working

4. Effective project management, time management and communication skills.
5. Experience in building productive working relationships with other researchers.

Desirable Criteria

1. A higher research degree.
2. Authorship of peer-reviewed research publications.
3. Experience of building productive working relationships with staff in a clinical trials unit or other clinical research infrastructures.
4. Experience of developing and submitting research funding applications.

It is expected that the post holder will deliver this role at their usual place of work, with intermittent travel for Wales-based or UK-based meetings as required.
